Virginia's WMATA Board Members will report on Metro's progress in meeting recommendations pertaining to safety, reliability, customer service and financial management from NVTC's Jan. 2016 report.

Envision Route 7

Commissioners will hear a presentation on the preferred mode and alignment for new transit on Route 7 between Tysons and the City of Alexandria in advance of June public meetings.
